Ecological Conversion

In June the Congregation Team enthusiastically approved the International JPIC recommendation that the Congregation respond to Pope Francis' challenge to undergo an "ecological conversion". In these next months the JPIC committee will develop a process and materials that we will make available to our sisters, Associates and the extended Bon Secours family that will enable us to accept this challenge that Pope Francis offered to us. On September 7th, the JPIC Committee and some members of the Congregation Team will participate in a phone conference with input on ecological conversion from Sister Mary Elizabeth Clark, SSJ, Director of the SSJ Earth Center. In preparation for this conference call, committee members are reflecting on the questions below. We invite you to reflect on these questions, too, and to share your responses with others.

Reflection and Sharing

- A conversion is a turning toward something which requires a turning from something else. What do you hope an "ecological conversion" will enable you/Congregation to turn towards and turn from?
- > What do you need personally to enter into a process of ecological conversion? (eg. time, commitment, discipline, willingness, openness, perseverance, consistency, etc.)

During this Season of Creation each of us can pray for the grace of "radical availability" to enter into this process of ecological conversion for the sake of Earth, our common home.
