The **Season of Creation**, which runs annually from September 1 through October 4, unites the global Christian family around one shared purpose: caring for our common home. We celebrate this season by spending time in prayer, considering ways to inhabit our common home more sustainably, and lifting our voices in the public sphere on behalf of Earth.

This year, at the conclusion of the Season of Creation, the Congregation of Bon Secours will joyfully announce our participation in the Laudato Si' Action Platform – a commitment to a seven year journey towards living more sustainably — initiated by the Vatican Dicastery for Integral Human Development. Over these seven years we hope to design actions that will enable us, Sisters of Bon Secours, to meet the goals of the Laudato Si' Action Platform:

Respond to the cry of Earth and the cry of the poor,

Adopt a more sustainable lifestyle
Engage in and foster ecological education
Develop an ecological spirituality
Embrace ecological economics

Advocate for public policies that protect our common home and all those who share it.

We invite you, our Bon Secours Family, to join us in this exciting and transformative initiative that will enable us to more deeply live our mission focus: "to defend and care for all creation."

Season of Creation - The Laudato Si' Action Platform

In the May issue of the JPIC Newsletter, you read about the invitation from the Vatican Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development to participate in a seven-year journey to sustainability in the spirit of Pope Francis's landmark encyclical, Laudato Si', called the Laudato Si' Action Platform (LSAP) This invitation was extended to the universal Church – families, parishes and dioceses, educational and healthcare institutions, organizations and Congregations of Women and Men Religious - so that together we can take concrete steps toward a sustainable future for our planet to fulfill the vision of Laudato Si'. All of us collectively are invited to embark on this common journey toward the realization of God's dream for our common home: that we, in the words of Bon Secours, "defend and care for all creation" and reverence all beings on this beautiful planet as members of God's beloved community.

As Sister Rosie Jasinski shared in the Congregation Team report in July, the Congregation of Bon Secours will be among the first cohort of Congregations of Women Religious who will join the Laudato Si' Action Platform on October 4, 2021. With all we have done in the past six years to engage Laudato Si', we feel we are poised to commit ourselves to respond to Pope Francis invitation to embrace an "ecological conversion" in a deeper way through our public commitment to embark on this seven-year mission toward sustainability. We will pack lightly for this journey. All we really need is a listening heart to hear deeply the cries of God's poor people and the cries of Earth and the willingness to respond whole-heartedly in love and with Gospel hope to what we hear. Our destination is nothing short of personal and communal transformation toward the vision of integral ecology that Pope Francis describes so eloquently in Laudato Si'. He reminds us that, "We are faced not with two separate crises, one environmental and the other social, but rather with one complex crisis which is both social and environmental. Strategies for a solution demand an integrated approach to combating poverty, restoring dignity to the excluded, and at the same time protecting nature." (Laudato Si', 139).

Over these next seven years the Congregation of Bon Secours hopes to be part of the critical mass needed to create a global paradigm shift which is nothing short of a transformation of our relationship with Earth and all who share our common home. In the coming year, with input from the Bon Secours Family, we will assess what we are already doing to address the goals of Laudato Si', dream of what more could be possible and design a plan that will enable us to more fully realize this vision of Pope Francis' encyclical over the next seven years.

Secours Family as we prepare to participate in the Laudato Si' Action Platform on October 4th.

September 2: For a place in nature that has been holy ground for you.

September 3: For the health of the land, waters and all species on our planet especially in the places we call

home: Democratic Republic of Congo, France, Great Britain, Ireland, Peru and USA.

September 4: For all people of faith that they may see care of creation as an essential part of a life of faith.

PRAY:

September 5: For healing from our cultural addiction to fossil fuels.

September 6: For scientists who are developing non-petroleum-based energy sources.

September 7: For marine life endangered by plastic waste.

September 8: For the health of the land and waters of the Amazon.

September 9: For children of the future who will suffer from our current selfishness.

September 10: For subsistence fisher-folk who pull up nets full of rubbish.

September 11: For sanitation workers.

ACT: Refuse straws unless absolutely necessary. Use reusable bags when shopping. Eliminate at least

one plastic item from your house. Buy cartons or glass versus plastic whenever possible. Use less

plastic-packaged food. What commitment can you make to use less single-use items?

WEEK 3: SEPTEMBER 12-18

The entire material universe speaks of God's love, God's boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God. Laudato Si', #84

PRAY:

September 12: For a body of water that has refreshed your spirit

September 13: In thanksgiving for the miracle of water.

September 14: Every time you take a drink today, pray for those who do not have access to fresh water.

September 15: For the health of wetlands, swamps, bogs, and marshes.

September 16: For endangered marine species.

September 17: For people who advocate for environmental protection.

September 18: For the millions of people worldwide who lack access to proper sanitation facilities.

PRAY:

September 19: In thanks for the pollinator bees that feed you. September 20: For migrant workers who harvest your food.

September 21: International Peace Day - The military in the USA is a huge polluter. Pray for disarmament.

September 22: For forgiveness for our wastefulness in a world of want.

September 23: For cooks whose creativity delights our palates.

September 24: For organic farmers and gardeners. September 25: In thanks for your favorite vegetable.

commitment to "defend and care for all creation".

September 29: In thanksgiving for the beauties of the seasons.

September 30: For an animal companion who has enriched your life.

October 1: In thanksgiving for St. Therese of Lisieux who reminds us that, "an integral ecology is also made

up of simple daily gestures which break with the logic of violence, exploitation and selfishness."

October 2: In thanksgiving for Pope Francis and his world leadership in ecology.

October 3: In thanksgiving for our celebration of the Season of Creation.

October 4: In thanksgiving for St. Francis of Assisi who is our companion in faith in caring for creation.

Season of Creation 2021 Prayer

Creator of All,

We are grateful that from your communion of love you created our planet to be a home for all. By your Holy Wisdom you made the Earth to bring forth a diversity of living beings that filled the soil, water and air. Each part of creation praises you in their being, and cares for one another from our place in the web of life.

With the Psalmist, we sing your praise that in your house "even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young."
