Teaching and Education as drivers of peace

Pope Francis urged global leaders to spend more money on education and devote fewer resources to weapons in his 2022 World Day of Peace message.

"It is high time, then, that governments develop economic policies aimed at inverting the proportion of public funds spent on education and on weaponry."

Pope Francis urges us to view education as an investment, rather than an expenditure, which he says is vital for "promoting integral human development." Such investments, the pope says, "make individuals more free and responsible, and they are essential for the defense and promotion of peace."





"Labor is an expression of ourselves, our gifts and also of our commitment, self-investment and cooperation with others, since we always work with or for someone. 

Pax Christi International (PCI)

As members of Pax Christi International, we welcome Pope Francis' timely and relevant World Peace Day message to start a new year. Education and capacity building for peace and nonviolence is integral to the mission of Pax Christi International. This organization works with partners in every region of the world to teach people the Gospel roots of nonviolence and how they can put it into practice in their lives, families, schools, and communities. Here are a few ways PCI is already putting the message of Pope Francis into action:

- Using social media and apps for active nonviolence and peacebuilding in the DRC: This newly launched digital program teaches tech skills to young people in a collaborative way and focuses on using these tools for the promotion of active nonviolence and peacebuilding.
- A Policymaker's Tool for Effective, Nonviolent Strategies for Sustainable Peace: PCI recently published a practical guide for policymakers (and all those who want to make nonviolence a matter of policy). They brought together experts and stories from around the peace movement to highlight the importance of nonviolence for policymakers as well as how easy and cost-effective it can be. - Water for Life: In June PCI launched a new educational and advocacy campaign highlighting the need for water justice throughout the Americas as a result of extractive industries. The campaign calls on the international community for solidarity and action. Violations of the right to water are an intergenerational concern and disproportionately impact vulnerable groups in rural areas, including Afrodescendants, farmers, and Indigenous communities. https://paxchristi.net/2021/06/29/water-for-life/
