The Season of Creation is a liturgical season of prayer and action when the world's 2.2 billion Christians are invited to pray and care for creation. It runs annually from September 1 through October 4.

This year, the theme for the Season of Creation is *Listen to the Voice of Creation*. During this season our common prayer and action can help us listen to the many and varied beautiful voices in the natural world as well as the voices of those who are silenced. These are the voices of those in marginalized communities who suffer disproportionately the impacts of climate change. These are the voices of the Indigenous Peoples who hold generational wisdom about how to live gratefully within the limits of the land. These are the voices of a diminishing diversity of more-than-human species. In prayer we lament the individuals, communities, species, and ecosystems who are lost, and those whose livelihoods are threatened by habitat loss and climate change and we re-commit ourselves to care for our common home.

For the Sisters of Bon Secours, this Season also marks our commitment to begin implementing the Goals and SMART Actions each Area has developed in response to the Laudato Si' Action Platform. You will be hearing about these exciting actions in the near future from your Area Leadership and the members of the JPIC Committee.





If we learn how to listen, we can hear in the voice of creation a kind of dissonance. On the one hand, we can hear a sweet song in praise of our beloved Creator; on the other, an anguished plea, lamenting our mistreatment of this our common home. Laudato Si' Action Platform (LSAP) Update

In October 2021, the Congregation of the Sisters of Bon Secours of Paris joyfully accepted Pope Francis' invitation to participate in the Laudato Si' Action Platform – a commitment to a seven year journey towards more sustainable living -- initiated by the Vatican Dicastery for Integral Human Development. Since that time and after surveying the Congregation, holding many JPIC Committee and Area Team meetings and having conversations with Area and Congregational Leadership Teams, we have developed SMART goals that will help us address the seven LSAP goals for the year extending between September 2022 and September 2023. The LSAP goals each Area chose as priorities for 2022 - 2023 are:

Congregation of Bon Secours: Goal 6: Develop an Ecological Spirituality Bon Secours Ireland/Great Britain: Goal 1: Respond to the Cry of Earth and Goal 2: Respond to the Cry of the Poor Bon Secours Peru: Goals 1: Respond to the Cry of Earth; Goal 2: Respond to the Cry of the Poor; Goal 4: Adopt a more Sustainable Lifestyle; Goal 5: Engage in and Foster Ecological Education and Goal 7: Participate in Community Action for Systemic Change

Bon Secours USA: Goal 5: Engage in and Foster Ecological Education and Goal 6: Develop an Ecological Spirituality

Detailed SMART Actions for each of these Goals have been communicated to the Sisters and will be communicated to the members of the Bon Secours Family in the near future.

September 6:	For scientists who are developing non-petroleum-based energy sources.
September 7:	For marine life endangered by plastic waste.
September 8:	For the health of the land and waters of the Amazon.
September 9:	For children of the future who will suffer from our current selfishness.
September 10:	For subsistence fisher-folk who pull up nets full of rubbish.

- September 16: For endangered marine species.
- September 17: For people who advocate for environmental protection.

2022 Season of Creation Prayer

Creator of All,

From your communion of love your Word went forth to create a symphony of life that sings your praise.

By your Holy Wisdom you made the Earth to bring forth a diversity of creatures who praise you in their being. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge.

You called human beings to till and keep your garden. You placed us into right relationships with each creature so that we could listen to their voices and learn how to safeguard the conditions for life. But we turn in on ourselves and away from our co-creatures.

We close our ears to the counsel of our fellow creatures. We fail to listen to the cries of the poor and the needs of the most vulnerable. We silence the voices of those who hold the traditions that teach us to care for the Earth. We close our ears to your creative, reconciling and sustaining Word that calls to us through the Scriptures.

We lament the loss of our fellow species and their habitats that will never speak again. In this Season of Creation, we pray that you would call to us, as from the burning bush, with the sustaining fire of your Spirit. Breathe upon us. Open our ears and move our hearts. Turn us from our inward gaze. Teach us to contemplate your creation and listen for the voice of each creature declaring your glory. For "faith comes from hearing."

Give us hearts to listen for the good news of your promise to renew the face of the Earth. Enlighten us with the grace to follow the Way of Christ as we learn to walk lightly upon this holy ground. Fill us with the hope to quench the fires of injustice with the light of your healing love that sustains our common home.

In the name of the One who came to proclaim good news to all creation, Jesus Christ. Amen.
