UNANIMA at the United Nations:

- UNANIMA participated in the 66th Commission on the Status of Women through these events:
 - Women's Leadership and Resilience in the Face of Climate Change; co-sponsored by UNANIMA International.
 - Climate Change: Multiple Risks for Homeless Women and Girls; co-sponsored by UNANIMA and moderated by Jean Quinn, DW
 - Positive Change for Homeless Women Through Creativity; Opening and closing remarks were given by UNANIMA International.
 - Effective Pathways for Advocacy: Empowering Women/Girls on Issues of Climate Displacement and Homelessness; opening remarks by Jean Quinn
- Jean and Lara participated in two Expert Group Meetings: "Creating full and productive employment and decent work for all" and "Megatrends & Families: Focus on Digital Technologies, Migration and Urbanization". Both Jean and Lara submitted professional papers that were presented at this event. Jean's remarks focused on urbanization and homelessness as it relates to family policy. Lara presented on climate-related migration and its effects on families.

UNINAMA at the World Family Summit 2022, Geneva

Lara Hicks attended the World Family Summit from June 28th to June 29th at the Palace of Nations in Geneva, Switzerland. Each year, the Summit is convened by the World Family Organization and the UN Institute for Training and Research. The theme of the Summit this year was "Invest in Families – Local Authorities and Families working together to alleviate poverty and hunger, promote quality education and well- being, economic growth reducing inequalities in an inclusive environment of peace and security, and Leaving No Family Behind." Lara also took the opportunity to meet with civil society leaders based in Geneva, as well as develop connections with UN & NGO colleagues that UNANIMA International will continue to engage with at future Expert Group Meetings and Commissions.

UNANIMA and COP27

COP27 is the 2022 United Nations Climate Change Conference that will be held from November 6 – 18. Egypt assumes the incoming Presidency of COP 27 with a clear recognition of the gravity of the global climate challenge and appreciation of the value of multilateral, collective and concerted action as the only means to address this truly global threat. **UNANIMA International** will be co-organizing a side event for COP27, along with several other NGOs. UNANIMA International will be able to speak to the connections between environmental concerns, homelessness, and women & children as part of a round table led by the Carmelites. Jean Quinn and Lara Hicks will attend part of COP27 in Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt.





UNANIMA Woman of Courage Award Maria José Cavalcante



UNANIMA 2021 Woman of Courage Award

Every year UNANIMA International presents a Woman of Courage Award honoring women from around the world who inspire us with their courage and leadership. From April 27th to May 6th, 2022, Jean traveled to Maceio, Alagoas in northeastern Brazil and then to São Paulo in southern Brazil to present the 2021 UNANIMA Woman of Courage Award to Maria José Cavalcante, an event that had previously been postponed due to COVID-19.

The daughter of a landless poor father who worked in the sugarcane fields, Maria became a member of the Pastoral Land Commission as a young woman and worked to address the unjust land distribution and violence in her neighborhood. She was also a member of the Women's Rural Worker Movement. She has devoted her life to the struggle for land ownership for her people, even facing threats and violence from the large sugar cane owners and local police. After years of perseverance, thirty-five families including her own, were allotted the right to seven hectares of land per family. Maria shared that she was humbled that an insignificant person like her was the recipient of an international award.

UNANIMA 2023 Woman of Courage Award

Each July UNANIMA Congregations are asked to submit nominations for the Woman of Courage Award. All the Sisters of Bon Secours are invited to send any nominations to Sr. Rosie so start thinking of who you might nominate for this honor next July. Spread awareness regarding preservation and establish actions in the use, reuse of ecological resources with communities, associates, local authorities and associates.

- Health services, water infrastructure and basic sanitation managed in coordination with local governments at the end of the project.

In light of LSAP survey results and the conversations the JPIC USA LSAP Task Group had with the USA Leadership team, the Congregation of the Sisters of Bon Secours USA will focus on LSAP Goal 5 (Ecological Education) and Goal 6 (Ecological Spirituality) for the year September, 2022 – September, 2023.

- Engaging in and fostering ecological education and embracing an ecological spiritualty will enable us to live into and out of the emerging
 expression of the Bon Secours charism of compassion, healing and liberation for Earth and all her beings.
- The Bon Secours Retreat and Conference Center offers us an opportunity to advance both of these goals in new, exciting and evolving ways.
- We will build on and expand the SMART actions below each year of the LSAP journey.
