By engaging in ecological education and developing an ecological spirituality, we hope to become more "painfully aware" of what is happening to our planet and her people and respond by living more sustainably, using our financial resources on behalf of Earth's healing and advocating for public policies and practices that support planetary health. Laudato Si' Action Platform (LSAP)

Update

In July the Congregation Team approved the 2023-2024 LSAP Actions for Ireland/Great Britain and the United States. Plans for Peru are expected to be approved at the September meeting. As we celebrate the Season of Creation and the theme "Let Justice and Peace Flow" we present some of the actions that will enable justice to flow through the Bon Secours Family and beyond as we implement these LSAP initiatives:

Ireland/Great Britain:

- Will reduce fossil fuel use by at least 25% by installing Solar PV panels.
- Will form a book club with a goal of reading two ecological based books per year.
- Will plan an ecological pilgrimage for the Bon Secours family.

USA:

- The Native American Land Acknowledgement Working Group will finalize the land acknowledgement and roll it out to the CBS family with opportunities to reflect on and engage the acknowledgement, including an employee forum for education.
- The USA Leadership Team with the Buildings & Grounds Task Force will continue to explore land trusts, easements, deed restrictions and the transfer or selling of development rights, for the protection of our resources and will investigate their ramifications.
- JPIC USA Team will incorporate a short quote from Laudato Si' or other related text with a question for sharing in the employee newsletter and circulate to the Bon Secours family on a monthly basis for short 5 –10 minute discussion at committee meetings, department meeting, ministry meetings and events, etc.
- The JPIC USA Team will work with the USA Leadership Team and Retreat and Conference Center (RCC) managers to host a half day Laudato Si' retreat for all employees at Marriottsville on November 15, 2023.
- The JPIC USA Team will keep the RCC staff informed of web and print resources on ecological spirituality and education that can be included on the RCC website, retreat brochure, social media and electronic communications on a quarterly basis. Tessa will include JPIC LS themes in what she does as well. The Team will also continue to suggest presenters for programs at the Center.

Congregation of Bon Secours Laudato Si' Action Platform Prayer Initiative Season of Creation – Ecological Spirituality September 2023



Ecological Spirituality springs from a profound ecological conversion and helps us to "discover God in all things", both in the beauty of creation and in the sighs and groans of people afflicted in any way. We recognize the cosmos (all of creation, not just what we can see) as a place of God's continuing self-revelation and creation.

Call to Prayer: Let us pause to remember that we, Sisters of Bon Secours, have committed ourselves to a 7-year journey of transformation of our relationship with Earth and all who share our common home. This month as we commemorate the Season of Creation, let us especially remember our commitment to develop an ecological spirituality – a spirituality that acknowledges the cosmos (all of creation, not just what we can see) as a place of God's continuing self-revelation and creation.

(Pause for contemplative reflection)

Reading 1: Creation is of the order of love. God's love is the fundamental moving force in all created things. Every creature is thus the object of the Father's tenderness, who gives it its place in the world. Even the fleeting life of the least of beings is the object of God's love, and in its few seconds of existence, God enfolds it with affection. LS #77

Reflection

- What words, phrases or images from the psalm and reading resonate with you? Inspire you? Challenge you?
- Does this reading reflect your worldview?
- What does this reading ask of you?





Reading 2: When we speak of the "environment", what we really mean is a relationship existing between nature and the society which lives in it. Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or as a mere setting in which we live. We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it. LS #139

Pause for reflection

Reading 3: A healthy relationship with creation is one dimension of overall personal conversion. The Australian bishops spoke of the importance of such conversion for achieving reconciliation with creation: "To achieve such reconciliation, we must examine our lives and acknowledge the ways in which we have harmed God's creation through our actions and our failure to act. We need to experience a conversion, a change of heart." LS #218

Pause for reflection

Reflection and Sharing:

- Is your worldview shifting from seeing yourself apart from nature to seeing yourself a part of nature? If yes, are their habits you have adopted over these past few years that reflect this shift in your worldview?
- How might the Congregation of Bon Secours communally acknowledge ways we have harmed creation by our action and/or our inaction and truly lament and grieve our complicity in Earth's suffering?

Gathering the Graces:

What is a word, phrase, thought or feeling that you will take with you from this time of prayer together?

Closing Prayer

Creator of All,

From your communion of love your Word went forth to create a symphony of life that sings your praise. By your Holy Wisdom you made the Earth to bring forth a diversity of creatures who praise you in their being. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge.

You called human beings to till and keep your garden. You placed us into right relationships with each creature so that we could listen to their voices and learn how to safeguard the conditions for life. But we turn in on ourselves and away from our co-creatures.

We close our ears to the counsel of our fellow creatures. We fail to listen to the cries of the poor and the needs of the most vulnerable. We silence the voices of those who hold the traditions that teach us to care for the Earth. We close our ears to your creative, reconciling and sustaining Word that calls to us through the Scriptures. We lament the loss of our fellow species and their habitats that will never speak again. We grieve the loss of human cultures, along with the lives and

livelihoods that have been displaced or perished. Creation cries out as forests crackle, and animals alike flee the fires of injustice that we have lit by our unwillingness to listen.

In this Season of Creation, we pray that you would call to us with the sustaining fire of your Spirit. Breathe upon us. Open our ears and move our hearts. Turn us from our inward gaze. Teach us to contemplate your creation and listen for the voice of each creature declaring your glory. For "faith comes from hearing." Give us hearts to listen for the good news of your promise to renew the face of the Earth. Enlighten us with the grace to follow the Way of Christ as we learn to walk lightly upon this holy ground. Fill us with the hope to quench the fires of injustice with the light of your healing love that sustains our common home.

In the name of the One who came to proclaim good news to all creation, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Follow-up Action:

- 1. Make it a practice to connect with nature every day.
- 2. Include the needs of the natural world in your personal and community prayer.
- 3. Be intentional about taking personal responsibility for learning about ecological spir
- 4. Choose to read a book as a local community/cluster on ecological spirituality and form a discussion group to share new insights. Suggested authors include: Teilhard deChardin, Thomas Berry, Robin Wall Kimmerer, Joanna Macy
